Running Strong, Fellows Exceeds Goal and Raises Over \$100,000

Running a strong campaign for months, Fellows was initially poised to challenge Democrat incumbent Susan Gerhardt. It was announced recently that Gerhardt will no longer be seeking reelection to her position.

Fellows has been aggressively campaigning for the now open Assembly District 29 seat and has set and exceeded internal goals on all fronts of the campaign. One of Sean's most impressive recent benchmarks was to raise over \$100,000 in campaign contributions prior to the beginning of the filing period--a likely record pace of fundraising for a non-incumbent this early in the election cycle and a goal that Fellows has not only met but exceeded.

Other goals that Fellows has recently surpassed relate to voter contact. District 29 is sizeable and so a steady dedication to reaching voters one-on-one is viewed as critical. Sean has also surpassed his goal for the number of volunteers recruited and number of voters reached.
